Do I need an adapter to charge my phone in Prague?

Chargers for iPhones, Android phones and other smartphones or cell phones are usually dual voltage, so you can use them all over the world. However, it is possible you'll need an adapter to plug the charger into a Prague outlet. Prague uses electrical outlets and power plugs of types C & E (see images).

What is the standard power socket voltage in Prague?

All power sockets in Prague provide a standard voltage of 230V with a standard frequency of 50Hz. You can use all your equipment in Prague if the outlet voltage in your own country is between 220V-240V. This is the case in most of Europe, Australia, the United Kingdom and most countries in Africa and Asia.

Do I need a voltage converter in Prague?

If the standard voltage in your country is in the range of 100V-127V (which is most common in the US, Canada and countries in South America) you might need a voltage converter in Prague. The standard frequency in Prague is 50Hz. If this frequency differs from the frequency used in your home country, please use caution when plugging in your devices.

What if I forget to buy a socket in Prague?

If you forget to buy or work out what you need before you travel to Prague, you can buy everything when you arrive in local shops. The most common type of sockets in Czech Republic (and Prague) is so-called type E or French type electrical socket.

When you visit Prague and the Czech Republic you will need to use a special European electrical plug convertor (type E) to plug your phone, tablet, kindle or laptop charger in.

If you're heading to Prague, don't forget to pack the right plug adapter! The Czech Republic uses the type C and type E sockets, so make sure to grab an adapter that supports ...
